Trump Drops: New Hampshire Poll

Donald Trump's 'base' – Republican voters who are '<u>Strongly Favorable</u>' to Trump – has dropped by 35% in New Hampshire. Seven months ago, in October, 72% of Republican voters in New Hampshire were *Strongly Favorable* to Trump. Now, in St. Anselm College's Institute of Politics' May 7-10 poll, 47% of Republican voters are *Strongly Favorable* to Trump – a 25-point, or 35%, drop.¹ (Numbers refer to charts attached at the end of this narrative.)

That drop in Trump's 'base' mirrors the drop we saw in the national poll we took in March. Last October, nationally, 77% of Republican voters were *Very Favorable* to Trump. In March, nationally, 58% were *Very Favorable* – a 19-point, or 25%, drop.²

The St. Anselm poll, taken approximately one month after the national poll, shows a further drop in New Hampshire from 58% to 48%.

As the percentage of Republican voters who are *Strongly Favorable* to Trump dropped in New Hampshire, the number of voters *Somewhat Favorable* to Trump increased by 18 points. And Trump's Unfavorables increased by 4 points.¹

Why does the drop in Trump's Strongly Favorables matter?

Most Republican voters who are *Strongly Favorable* to Trump vote for Trump in the 2024
Republican Presidential primary. Most Republican voters who are *Somewhat Favorable* to
Trump do not vote for Trump.³ As Trump's *Strongly Favorables* drop, his vote drops in the 2024 primary.

Trump's allies like to say that 'Trump controls the Republican party.' They could say, <u>"in New Hampshire</u>, 81% of the Republicans are favorable to Trump," thus proving his control. But they ignore the fact that most Republican voters who are only *Somewhat Favorable* to Trump do not vote for Trump in the 2024 primary.

Why have Trump's Strongly Favorables dropped?

Last October, with Joe Biden as his opponent, just before the election, in St. Anselm's poll, 72% of the Republican voters in New Hampshire were *Strongly Favorable* to Trump. Now, Republican voters' disapproval of Trump's personality or character has eroded his base.

A New Hampshire Republican voter who likes both Trump's Policies and Personality is likely to be *Strongly Favorable* to Trump. A voter who likes Trump's Policy but not his Personality is likely to be *Somewhat Favorable* to Trump.⁴

Currently, 37% of New Hampshire Republican voters like <u>both</u> Trump's Policy and Personality – while 53% like his <u>Policy but not his Personality.</u> 8% dislike both. A total of 61% of New Hampshire Republican voters <u>dislike</u> Trump's personality.

How these three groups – Like Both, Like Policy Not Personality, Dislike Both – vote in the 2024

Republican Presidential primary is very different. Most Republicans who 'Like Both' vote for

Trump. Most Republicans who like Trump's policy but <u>not</u> his Personality do not vote for

Trump.⁵

The number of New Hampshire Republicans who would vote to elect Trump regardless of who runs against him in the primary reflects similar divisions based on Trump's personality. 36% - a

significant but not overwhelming number – of New Hampshire Republican voters said they would vote to elect Trump 'regardless' of who ran against him in the 2024 primary. 48% said they would 'not necessarily' vote for Trump. 16% said they would vote against Trump. 6

The first group – with more voters who are Strongly Favorable to Trump, who approve of Trump's personality – votes for Trump in the primary. The second and third groups do not vote for Trump. 7,8

Voters in New Hampshire also say, overwhelmingly, that a candidate's stands on issues is more important to them than a candidate's loyalty to Trump – by a margin of 91% to 8%.⁹

In our previous national poll, in April, 50% of the Republican voters said Trump opposing a Republican candidate in a primary made no difference to them; in New Hampshire, in May, 46% said it would make no difference. Trump opposing a Republican candidate in a primary made little difference in the national poll – it made more difference in New Hampshire.¹⁰

However, there is a downside to Trump's endorsement. In the general election Trump's negatives with Undeclared voters (as Independents are called in New Hampshire) would hurt a Republican candidate he endorses. In New Hampshire, since there are nearly equal numbers of Republican (28%) and Democrat (29%) voters, a candidate needs to win 'Undeclared' voters to be elected.

Trump lost Undeclared voters to Joe Biden by 12 points in the 2020 election. ¹¹ Currently, with Undeclared voters Biden is Favorable 51%, Unfavorable 47%. Donald Trump's Favorable – 36% – is much lower, and his Unfavorable – 62% – is much higher. ¹² While Biden is +4 positive, Trump is -26 negative.

Worse, for a candidate Trump endorses, 56% of the Undeclared voters are <u>Strongly</u>

Unfavorable to Trump.¹³ And almost all vote for Biden.¹⁴ Trump's endorsement would be helpful to a Republican candidate in New Hampshire in a primary but would hurt the same candidate in the General Election.

Trump won the 2020 election. New Hampshire voters disagree with Trump's claim 58% to 28%. However, Republican voters Agree 57%, Disagree 19%, Unsure 24%. Most Republican voters who agree with Trump vote for Trump in the 2024 primary; most Republican voters who don't agree or who are not sure – a total of 43% of Republican voters – do not vote for Trump. 16

'<u>Trump lies'</u>. 60% of Republicans Disagree that Trump lies, but 40% either Agree or are Unsure. 17 Most of the first group votes for Trump in the primary. The second two groups do not vote for Trump. 18

<u>General Election.</u> In the General Election, with all voters, Joe Biden has a Favorable of 51%, Unfavorable 48%. Trump has a Favorable of 41%, Unfavorable 58%. Overall Biden, net is +3; Trump is -17 – a difference of 20 points.²¹ General Election voters believe Trump 'Brags and Boasts' (89%), that Trump 'Bullies' (62%), and that Trump 'Lies' (59%).²²

Trump's personality, or character, is also a problem for Trump in the General Election: 18% of the voters like <u>Both</u> Trump's Policy and Personality. 29% like his Policy but <u>not</u> his Personality. 52% dislike both.²³ In all, 81% of New Hampshire dislike Trump's personality.

<u>Summary</u>

<u>General Election.</u> Joe Biden is narrowly popular (+3) in New Hampshire. But Donald Trump is unpopular (-17). Trump trails Biden on the 2024 ballot by 8 points (Biden 51%, Trump 43%), primarily because Biden wins the Undeclared voters.

<u>2024 Republican Primary.</u> Trump's base has dropped 35% since the election. His 'elect Trump regardless' number in the Republican primary is only 36%. And a candidate's stands on issues matters much more to Republican voters than his or her loyalty to Trump. Trump remains an influential figure. But his base has dropped 35%.

Trump's decline is primarily due to his personality or character – 61% of Republican voters disapprove of his personality.

The best-known candidate, Trump leads in the primary (52% vote Trump, 48% not Trump). But, because voters who are 'Somewhat Favorable' to Trump are far less likely to vote for him, if his base continues to decline his vote in the primary is likely to decline.
